Latvian Porcelain Figurine Zemgale Folk Dancer, by Riga Porcelain Factory, circa 1960s.

Petite, charming and spirited, the figurine stands a little over 4" tall, the plinth is 1 1/2" across. The figurine depicts a young Latvian girl in national costume, dancing the Zemgale folk dance.

In excellent condition. Upon close inspection, a small spot of missing glaze under the girl's right hand can be noticed, clearly a glazing accident. It is not easily noticeable, and there is no post-production wear visible to the naked eye.

Zemgale folk dance, originating in the Zemgale region of Latvia, is a traditional dance style characterized by its unique regional costumes, steps, and music. The music typically incorporates variations of polka and gallop. This dance is a way to preserve and celebrate Latvian cultural heritage. It is performed in various social settings, such as festivals, weddings, and the annual Song and Dance Festival.

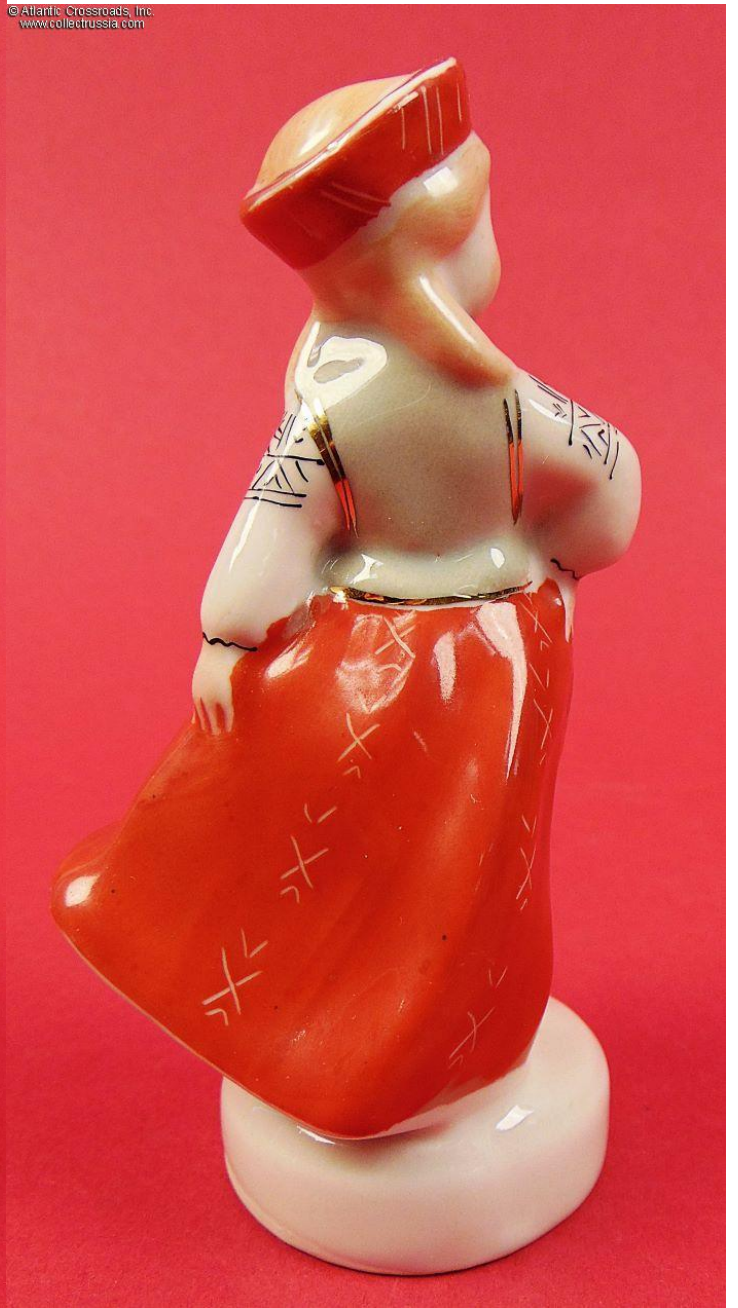
